## **Budget Model Principles**

McMaster's budget captures strategic spending to support the five strategic priorities:

- 1. Inclusive Excellence
- 2. Teaching and Learning
- 3. Research and Scholarship
- 4. Engaging Local, National, Indigenous and Global Communities
- 5. Operational Excellence

#### **BMTF I Principles:**

- Promote transparency, trust and engagement
- Assure financial responsibility, accountability and fairness
- Advance the efficient use of physical and human resources
- Have predictability and stability
- Enable innovation, creativity and change
- Assign fiscal and academic responsibility to the appropriate levels
- Build the student learning experience both inside and outside the classroom
- Enable rapid response to opportunities

#### **BMTF II Guidelines:**

- Support and enhance the academic mission
- Avoid the creation of "silos" and promote cooperation
- Keep things simple (concept of "materiality" and simple to administer)



## **Activity-Based Budget Allocation**

### REVENUE

Allocated to Faculties based on activity (student enrolment and teaching)

#### **Two Strategic Funding Pools (tax)**


- Research Discretionary Fund: VP Research strategic research initiatives
- University Fund: Provost for pan-university strategic purposes


#### **Central Support Unit Costs**

- These are charged directly to Faculties based on a relevant proxy-based cost driver
- Facilities, Utilities, Deferred Maintenance: Net assignable square metres (NASM)
- Human Resources: Employee FTEs
- Student Support: Graduate and/or Undergraduate FTE

# Graduate Funding Where it comes from, where it goes

## First, Recent News

#### March 28, 2023, Federal Budget

- No new funding for grad students
- Funding frozen since 2003 at \$17,500 (Master's) and \$21,000 (PhD)

#### March 23, 2023, Ontario Budget

- More of the same
- Ontario universities continue to receive lowest per-student government funding in Canada





To help ensure Ontario's universities can continue to transform, support students and the province, Ontario's universities continue to call for additional financial supports and the fast tracking of a multi-year tuition framework.

#### **Tuition**

 Tuition was rolled back 10% in 2019-2020, subsequently frozen


#### **Government Grants**

Operating grant has been flat since 2016-2017

#### **Donor Funds**


 These are often locked and not at the discretion of a university unit (Wilson Gift)

#### Where Revenue Goes




## **University Funding at a Glance**

## Follow the Funding

#### **Sources of Graduate Funding**

- McMaster employment, primarily Teaching and Research Assistantships
- Competitive internal and external scholarships
- School of Graduate Studies Scholarship Fund and other departmental sources
- Research grants and contacts, primarily supervisor's contribution
- Bursaries, based on need.
- Academic grants, based on need and academic merit

#### **Distribution of Funding**

- Funding varies by Faculty and by department
- Faculties, departments decide how to allocate funds to Master's and PhD students







## **Important Considerations**

#### **Council of Ontario Universities (COU)**

- Champions higher ed, including graduate students
- McMaster and others work closely with COU to lobby on behalf of students

#### Value of a McMaster Degree

- Education is an investment
- McMaster graduates enjoy successful careers
